Immediate Release

(Washington, D.C.) The Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia (Commission) approved four actions items before the Commission at its May 23rd Open Meeting. The matters include:

1. [Formal Case No. 1142, In the Matter of the Merger of AltaGas Ltd. and WGL Holdings, Inc.](#) On May 8, 2018, AltaGas Ltd., WGL Holdings, Inc., and Washington Gas Light Company (Settling Parties) filed a Consent Motion to Reopen the Record in Formal Case No. 1142 to Allow for Consideration of Unanimous Full Settlement Agreement and Stipulation and to Waive Public Interest Hearing on Proposed Settlement. This Order grants the request to reopen the record in this proceeding to permit consideration of the Settlement Agreement contained in the Consent Motion. However, the Commission holds in abeyance the request to waive the hearing required by Section 130.11 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. The Settling Parties' proposed procedural schedule is adopted with the exception of the public interest hearing date. The Commission tentatively schedules a public interest hearing on June 13, 2018, at 11:00 a.m. in the Commission hearing room for the purpose of considering whether the Settlement Agreement proffered in this proceeding is in the public interest. The Commission also schedules a community hearing on June 13, 2018, at 6:30 p.m. to receive input from the public on the Settlement Agreement. Unless the parties are informed otherwise, the June 13th hearings will proceed as scheduled. [Formal Case No. 1151, In the Matter of the Impact of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 on the Existing Distribution Service Rates and Charges for Potomac Electric Power Company and Washington Gas Light Company.](#) This Order grants the request to waive the hearing required by Section 130.11 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure in the Joint Motion for Approval of the Unanimous Agreement of Stipulation and Full Settlement filed by Washington Gas Light Company ("WGL"), the Office of the People's Counsel for the District of Columbia, the Apartment and Office Building Association of Metropolitan Washington and the Small Business Utility Advocates. The Commission invites all persons interested in commenting on WGL's proposed Settlement Agreement to submit written comments no later than the close of business, June 18, 2018.
3. [Electric Tariff 00-2, In the Matter of Potomac Electric Power Company's Public Occupancy Surcharge Electricity Tariff, P.S.C.-D.C. No. 1.](#) This Notice of Final Tariff approves the Potomac Electric Power Company's updated Rider Public Space Occupancy Surcharge effective with meter readings on and after March 1, 2018 and officially upon publication of this Notice of Final Tariff in the D.C. Register.
4. [Telephone Application 2012-04, In the Matter of the Notification of a Pro Forma Change in Intermediate Ownership and Control of PEG Bandwidth DC, LLC.](#) This Order accepts PEG Bandwidth DC, LLC's

notification to the Commission of its intra-corporate pro forma change of ownership and control. The Commission shall undertake no further review of the transaction for lack of Commission jurisdiction.
