DCPSC Annual Report shows leadership in achieving District's clean energy Goals

(WASHINGTON, D.C.) – The Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia (Commission) today released its Combined Annual Report titled, “[Transition: Toward a Clean Energy Future.](#)” This comprehensive report underscores the Commission's pivotal role in advancing the District's climate change commitments and its ambitious target of achieving 100% renewable energy by 2032.

Highlighting a landmark achievement within the PowerPath DC initiative, the Commission announced the allocation of a \$2.5 million contract to Preservation for Affordable Housing for the implementation of a groundbreaking Community Geothermal pilot project in Ward 8. This initiative marks a significant stride towards sustainable energy solutions and underscores the Commission's dedication to fostering innovation in renewable energy technologies.

The report provides an overview of the Commission's key initiatives, including ProjectPipes, DC PLUG, and the Capital Grid Project, which collectively contribute to enhancing the District's energy infrastructure and resilience. Moreover, the Commission has initiated internal programs aimed at cultivating an inclusive workplace environment, exemplified by the establishment of the Because You Matter Committee and the introduction of engaging programs commemorating Black History and Women's History Month.

The Commission reports annually on its operations, activities, and accomplishments to the Mayor, D.C. Council, and the general public. The report also provides an overview of the Commission's regulatory and organizational achievements and service to District electricity, natural gas, and local telecommunications customers.
