The Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia (“Commission”), hereby gives notice that the Potomac Electric Power Company (“Pepco”) is hosting a meeting of the Transportation Electrification Working Group (“TE Working Group”) on **Monday, December 9, 2019**, from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. at Pepco's Edison Place Office at 701 9th Street NW, Washington, D.C. 20068.

The TE Working Group was established by Order No. 19898 to “further explore and develop” specific transportation electrification offerings proposed by Pepco.¹ On December 4, 2019, Pepco at the request of the TE Working Group requested that the Commission issue this public notice.

The meeting will focus on Pepco's Offering 5 (Multi-Dwelling Unit Charging). Persons interested in participating in the TE Working Group may review the minutes from the prior TE Working Group meetings on the Commission’s eDocket, under Case No. “FC1155.”
