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Public Service Commission Hosts Technical Conference for Phase 1 of the MEDSIS Initiative

The Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia (Commission) in conjunction with its consultant, Smart Electric Power Alliance (SEPA), is hosting the Phase 1 Technical Conference in the Modernizing the Energy Delivery System for Increased Sustainability (MEDSIS) Initiative.

The Phase 1 Technical Conference will take place on Wednesday, June 27, 2018 from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. in the Commission's Hearing Room, located at 1325 G Street N.W., Suite 800 Washington, D.C. 20005.

The goals of this daylong event are to: (1) determine the scope and appropriateness of a system assessment of D.C.'s energy delivery system; and (2) identify the working groups for Phase 2 of the Initiative.

In Phase 2, these working groups will address a wide variety of grid modernization related topics, including what framework and guidelines are needed to implement MEDSIS Pilot Projects to be funded by the \$21.5 million fund established as a condition of the PHI-Exelon merger. Potential working groups include: Pilot Projects, Non-Wire Alternatives (NWAs), Utility Distribution Integrated Resource Planning (DIRP), Distributed Energy Resources (DERs), and Consumer Protections.
