DCPSC Offices Shut Down Over High Carbon Monoxide Levels in Building

(WASHINGTON, D.C.) – The offices of the Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia, located at 1325 G Street, N.W., have been temporarily closed due to elevated levels of carbon monoxide on the 2nd floor of the building. As a precautionary measure, the building has been evacuated by the DC Fire and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Department. There have been no reports of illness related to this incident. Until further notice, our offices will remain closed as DC Fire and EMS work diligently to address and rectify the situation.
